<u>Course Structure</u>: This is a middle school preparatory mathematics course. Students will attend for 60 minutes, five days a week, which time includes taking notes, solving

problems, at-home practice, & completing stations. Partner & group projects are to be determined. Learning will be assessed using worksheets, projects, quizzes, & tests.

### Required Materials: By Tuesday, September 5th, you must have:

- One Math Notebook Our notebook will be used to collect notes and key documents from the year.
- 2. One Graphing Calculator: TI-83 & TI-84 are both acceptable

\*You may choose to get a scientific calculator; however, I recommend graphing as your child will be able to use it throughout high-school and college. On Amazon, they range from roughly \$75-\$105 depending on the model. I am not responsible for lost or damaged items, and will stress the importance of being responsible for personal property.

<u>Academic Expectations</u>: Students are expected to try their best on all assignments. I understand that middle school can be challenging, especially with the increase in classwork from all teachers. Students have a Wolftime period each day where they can complete assignments & receive help from their teachers. Participation in worksheets, answering questions, stations, and note taking is expected of a middle school student.

Of course, I understand that students come into the classroom with a variety of needs and maturity levels, but that only furthers the emphasis on TEAM. You have a commitment from me that I will work as hard as possible on behalf of your child to help them succeed!
